<u>THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – HYMN StF No. 691 – part</u>

What shall our greeting be: sign of our unity ? "Jesus is Lord !" He comes to save us now; to serve him is to know life's true reward. May he our lives amend, all our betrayals end: Give me your hand, my friend – Jesus is Lord !

COMMENT:

Fred Pratt Green wrote this hymn, and several others, often on the theme of social justice and peace, including "The Church of Christ in every age", "It is God who holds the nations in the hollow of his hand" and "God is here!" and many more in our hymnary. He served 40 years as a Methodist minister, retiring ("Sitting down") in 1969 and devoted himself to hymn writing.

This hymn is found in the Life and Unity in the Church section of our hymn book.

We all need each other in a church fellowship, being of one mind, one heart, one faith. Unity is a positive thing, rather than an emphasis on the potential differences which can affect a fellowship.

We are all from different backgrounds, and we share many varying stories of our coming to faith. The overarching thing is that, as the author says, we share the belief that "Jesus is Lord!"

We are called to serve God in whatever way we are gifted, and, sometimes, if we feel we are <u>not</u> gifted, or fitted for a particular task. There is a phrase "Saved to serve" and I think that is what Fred is saying, when he says Christ comes into our lives "to save us now", continuing with the statement that to "serve him" brings its own "true reward".

When we are called to a role in the church, we are empowered by the Holy Spirit, which empowering changes us, so that "our lives are amended", and any rifts ("betrayals"?) with others end. We are then enabled to regard all others as "my friend" and working together we strive to bring about God's kingdom where we are, sharing and proving the indisputable fact that "Jesus is Lord !" Every blessing, *John*.
