**THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - ROMANS 12 verse 12.**

***"Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer."***

**COMMENT:**

This quotation from St. Paul's letter to the church in Rome, is part of his discourse on Christian conduct. The whole chapter is well worth a quiet reflection.

Life is made up of ups and downs, happy times and sad. We need to perhaps discover how to rejoice more over the good things, than to quietly accept them all, and seeming to take them for granted. It is by giving God the glory, that we can point others to God.

After all, God is shepherd of our souls, and longs to be shepherd to all people.

Suffering is not something we endure easily, and the often quite natural response is "Why me"? Suffering comes in several forms- mental anguish, physical pain, spiritual dryness, as if we are in a spiritual desert at times. All are part of life, and it is then that we are grateful for help, from wherever it comes, referring back to the human "angels" of last week's service.

Prayer is the mainstay of the Christian's life, and it is, in its simplest form, just talking to God; for a trouble shared is one halved - and again referring back to last week, Jesus said, "come to me all who are burdened and heavy laden and I will give you rest".
