THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - PSALM 20 verse 4

"May the Lord grant you your heart's desire, and fulfil all your plans". <u>COMMENT:</u>

We make plans for the future with the hope that, God willing, they will actually materialise. It is a matter of hope for what is yet to come, not a certainty. The beauty of life as a Christian is that it is a partnership with God, with the Lord very much as a senior partner. Or that is how it should be.

That partnership is maintained through prayer, through reading the scriptures, through heeding life's experiences, and through communication with others who may offer help or advice. Worship is also a vehicle to knowing God's will and purposes for us.

So often, though, we try to struggle on, in our own wisdom: and only when things go wrong, seek God's guidance.

These words from David assure us that God WANTS the best for us, wants to grant our hearts ' wishes, and to help us to fulfil our plans.

Perhaps the lesson here is that we should HAVE plans and desires, and not just drift through life. After all life is to be lived to the full, and we only have one shot at it.

However, Jesus also said "I come that they might have life abundantly", here and now - life that is fulfilling and purposeful, and through faith in him, we can also know life eternal. Every blessing, *John*.
