STREAMING OF SERVICES: Currently we are not allowed to stream any services. The stated reason for this is Safeguarding. I have spent some time and effort arguing the case that only the lectern and organ are shown, but this apparently is not enough. In addition, I have been told that some local preachers either do not wish to be on streaming or are unhappy about it and the recent LWPT meeting minutes record: "All those who are taking part in worship must be asked if they agree and give consent". Obviously with a large congregation, this would be unmanageable. With such a condition deciding whether streaming should occur, this creates unpredictability. I believe that the on-line services should be reliable, which in the current situation I cannot achieve, so it is with deep regret that I have withdrawn my offer to stream, and will be removing our channel from You Tube and removing all references to streaming from our web site. I have tried my best and failed. I will do all I can to continue supporting our church, by looking after slides and sound, keeping our web site up to date and offering help where I can be of service. COMMENT:

This wonderful poetic hymn is almost a lament as the author recalls in a most sensitive way the events of our Lord's Passion, when he realises that it was "for his sake" that our Lord chose to die.

As we think, this Palm Sunday of the triumphal entry of Jesus on a lowly colt into the holy city, it was the precursor of life changing events. It also highlights the fickle nature of people who could atone stage shout "Hosannas" and within days shout "Crucify!".

As we enter Holy week and all that we remember of Jesus's suffering, following our spiritual preparation during Lent, may we once again lift up our hearts in love and gratitude to our God who sent his only Son to die in our place, to bring us forgiveness, to bring us back to God, and to give us hope of life eternal. We look forward to the glorious statement on Easter Day that "He is not here, he is risen!"
