THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK – Traffic Chaos ?

<u>Food for Thought</u> – Around Bromsgrove for the past year or so, we have been delayed it seems when driving on all of the main roads. A journey which used to take five or so minutes now takes around 15, from the outskirts into the town centre – at rush hour it can be half an hour! We can only hope that when the road works are finally completed, that we shall be rewarded for our patience and disruption.

When sat in the car waiting interminably for the lights to change to green, I have reflected how traffic control is in some ways akin to life. After all, life is a journey.

There are three phases to the traffic lights – red for stop or stay where you are. Amber for get ready to slow to a stop, or prepare to move on. Green to forge ahead, with caution of course.

There are periods in life when we are on stop. Sometimes caused by unemployment, other times by illness, other times by indecision about the choices presented: we simply

don't know which road to take. These periods of being at a standstill can be fruitful, enabling us to re-set, to re-calibrate certain aspects of our lives; to recharge ourselves mentally, physically and spiritually.

Amber reflects those times when we have to consider whether we should slow down in the race through life, to consider if we are trying to hard, pushing ourselves beyond what is sensible for us, leading us to take perhaps time out. Amber is also the time, when we have reached some conclusion and are getting ready to go ahead with our latest plans.

Green is when we have the faith to step forward, with confidence, and trust in God's will and purposes in our lives, and we "go for it", wholeheartedly, though with awareness of the other road-users' welfare – those who are our fellow travellers in life.

So, when we are inclined to grumble about traffic lights, we have to realise that without them the chaos on the roads would be far worse. Equally without the times of red, amber and green in our lives, how much more difficult things could turn out to be.
