THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - Colossians 3 verses 14 & 15

Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which you were called in the one body, and be thankful. <u>REFLECTION:</u>

This short passage from the 'new life in Christ' section of Paul's letter to Colossae, reminds us that the key to our Christian living is always love.

Love is the opposite of envy, resentment, pride, self-seeking, and the other attitudes which manifest themselves, when the example set by Jesus is not followed.

Love is that attitude of having goodwill towards all whom we meet, the attempt to put the needs of others, when perceived, before our own. It precludes arguing, disagreements, conflict, in other words it enables "perfect harmony" to prevail in our dealings with one another.

Peace within our hearts, can then extend to the community in which we live, our personal environment, indeed, we should avoid anything which can cause strife or disharmony, while, (difficult) trying to stand up against what is unjust, wrong, or oppressive.

Paul ends this statement with the admonition to "be thankful". We can never be grateful enough to our God of love for all his blessings, received by us on a daily basis. Being clothed with love is an outward sign of our being thankful to God. May we learn to love, for love overcomes all things. Every blessing, *John*.
